DISTANCE FINDING TABLE AND EXPLANATION OF ITS USE

The method of using the table is as follows: Desiring to find the distance between two points, first find in the table the first of these points in alphabetical order, follow down the vertical row of numbers from this point until it intersects the horizontal column running across the table to the other point. In the square at this intersection is given the approximate distance in miles between the two points in question BY THE SHORTEST ROUTE FOLLOWING THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM.

IN CASE OF ACCIDENT

The driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury or death of any person or a total property damage to apparent extent of \$50.00 or more shall call upon a reasonably possible, report such accident to the local traffic enforcement officials, and within 10 days after such accident forward a written report of such accident to the Motor Vehicle Department, Madison, Wisconsin. If public liability insurance was carried on the date of the accident secure from your insurance agent a notice of insurance policy (Form SR-21) properly completed, corrects, sheriffs, county clerks, insurance agents, county and state traffic officials.

MOTOR VEHICLE SIZE AND WEIGHT REGULATIONS IN WISCONSIN

General Restrictions:

- Maximum Length of Vehicle & Trailer - 35 Ft.
- Maximum Length of Vehicle & Trailer - 45 Ft.
- Maximum Width of Load - 8 Ft.
- Maximum Height of Vehicle - 12 1/2 Ft.

Exceptions to General Gross Weight Restrictions: Apply only to vehicles registered before July 8, 1949 and expire June 30, 1951.

Where "W" is the gross weight in pounds permitted on vehicle or axle combinations and "L" is the distance to the nearest foot between the foremost and nearest axle under consideration.

PUBLIC HUNTING AND FISHING GROUNDS

The Wisconsin Conservation Department has established numerous public hunting and fishing grounds, primarily in southern Wisconsin adjacent to heavily populated sections. These areas vary in size from less than 1,000 to several thousand acres. In most instances the hunting and fishing rights have been leased from private landowners. Other areas have been purchased outright, and are being developed in a program which contemplates hunting and fishing in the best interests of the public.

Funds for this purpose are derived mainly from the extra fifty cents added to the hunting license fee in 1943. Lands are also acquired for this purpose with money collected from the sale of voluntary sportsmen's licenses.

In addition to these areas, large sections of northern Wisconsin are open to public hunting and fishing. Included in these units are forest crop, conservation commission, land commission, U. S. Forest Service, U. S. Fish & Wildlife Service, and county-owned lands.

Central Wisconsin Conservation Area
Purchased originally by the Federal Government, this land is now leased to the Wisconsin Conservation Department to develop and manage as a wildlife and forest area.

Horicon Marsh Wildlife Area
The Conservation Department, in conjunction with the Federal Government, has been acquiring and developing Horicon Marsh as a wildlife restoration area. Partially closed to hunting.

Kettle Moraine State Forest
This area in southeastern Wisconsin, is being acquired and developed for recreational and forestry purposes, and is open to public hunting.
