Wisconsin requires all adults to use seat belts. All children up to age 4 must be in a child safety seat. You may be stopped by a law enforcement official if your child under 8 is not in a safety seat or buckled up.

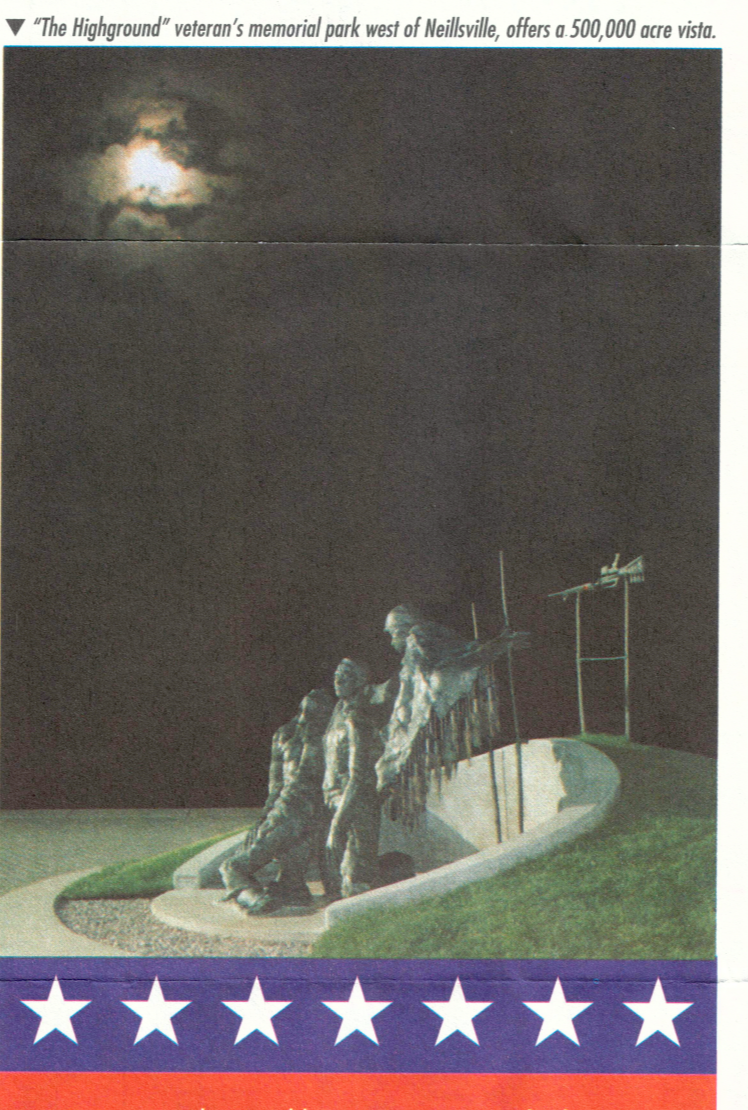
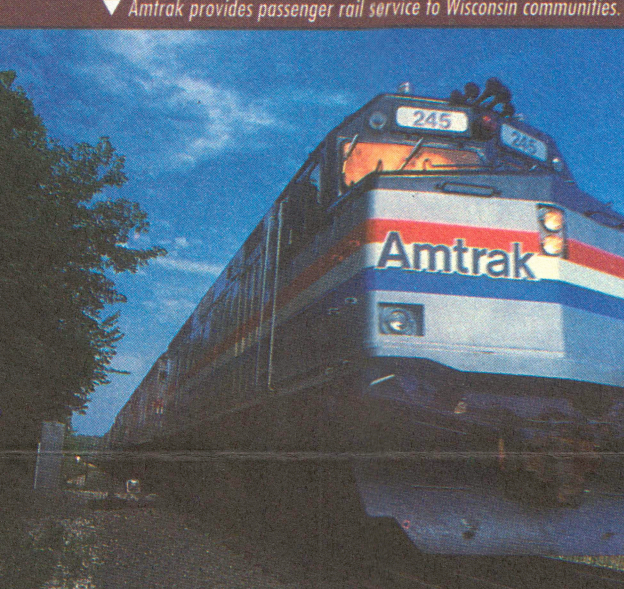
